





As part of a Water Positive Initiative, a Kalyani at the base of Shivagange Hills was restored in collaboration with the Karnataka State Pollution Control Board (KSPCB). The activity involved 50 participants in cleaning, dewatering, and desilting the historic waterbody. The restoration improved water quality and revived aquatic and bird life, making the site a space for community recreation and environmental benefit.

Water Positive workshop

A project aimed at rejuvenating local water bodies combined scientific research with community participation. Using QGIS software, the team analyzed 20 years of satellite imagery to study land use, vegetation, and watershed changes. Detailed drainage maps and LULC models provided insights into water flow and evolving land management practices.

Decadal weather data, including rainfall and temperature trends, were also assessed to understand long-term environmental shifts. Integrating geospatial analysis with local knowledge, the project designed a sustainable rejuvenation plan to enhance water recharge, retention, and overall ecosystem resilience.

Over 120 participants from 25 colleges joined the initiative. Sri Mahesh, Director, EMPRI, discussed environmental data and policy frameworks; Sri Vishwanath Srikantaiah, Founder, Biome, spoke on sustainable water management; Dr. Jija Hari Singh, I.P.S. (Retd), emphasized public responsibility in conservation; and Sri Ramprasad, Founder, Friends of Lake, highlighted citizen-led restoration models inspiring collective environmental action.

The Bengaluru Eco Summit 2025 was an eye-opening and empowering experience that brought together environmentalists, entrepreneurs, students, and policymakers on a single platform. The sessions on green economies, beauty and wellness, and home remedies provided practical insights into real-world eco-solutions. 


